1. Course Objectives & Course Summary

This is a skills-based class for students with advanced English proficiency. The focus of the class will be to continue language development, participating in group and whole-class discussions, vocabulary expansion, improving listening comprehension, pronunciation practice, accent, intonation, and developing critical thinking skills in the English language. The course aims to build on and refine skills learned in previous ESL courses. Students will learn how to maintain and expand conversations to deliver their messages clearly and effectively.

2. Teaching Method

Students will complete tasks in pair/group work through various tasks, projects, and activities, each tailored with different language focus and skill application goals. These activities can be rotated cyclically throughout the course, offering consistency in course structure and variety in content and application. Emphasis will be given to pronunciation, fluency, grammar, vocabulary, and listening. An example list of activities is as follows.

- Handouts/worksheets reviews covering essential target language, coupled with partner/group dialogue, and independent study or other conversation-based activities.
- In-class review worksheets to assess student knowledge and able application of material covered in the course.
